GENERAL ORDER 23-0018

As set forth in 18 U.S.C. § 3605, a court, after imposing a sentence, may transfer jurisdiction over a person on probation or supervised release to the district court for any other district to which the person is required or permitted to proceed, with the concurrence of the transferee court. The statute authorizes the transferee court to exercise all supervisory powers over the probationer or releasee, but does not direct transfer of the person's financial records or funds held by the Clerk in the transferor (sentencing) district to the transferee (supervising) district.

Therefore, effective immediately and until further Order of the Court, the Clerk of Court shall not transfer to, or receive from, other District Courts, any money owed for fines, restitution, special assessments, or debt records, regardless of whether supervision is transferred at the request of the United States Probation Office from one District to another.

Nothing in this order prevents the transfer of supervision if both courts concur. The order instead provides only that should supervision be transferred, the financial obligations and records will continue to be maintained by the sentencing court.
