Re: COVID-19 Testing of Detainees

Possible exposure to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) generates health and safety concerns for

detainees, law enforcement officers, judges, Pretrial Services Officers, Clerk's Office staff, attorneys, and

the public. Because early detection of infection can protect persons against unnecessary exposure,

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that, effective immediately, any individual arrested in the

Eastern Division of the Northern District of Illinois shall be administered a test for the Coronavirus prior

to entering the Dirksen Courthouse. The law enforcement agency carrying out the arrest must arrange

for this testing and may do so at any location convenient to the arresting agency. Staff at the

Metropolitan Correctional Center have advised the Court that they have the capacity to perform the

testing and that arresting agents may bring arrested persons to the MCC for testing. A detainee who

tests positive will be confined at the Metropolitan Correctional Center in isolation pending the scheduling

of an initial appearance. Should the arrestee test negative for Coronavirus, the arresting agency will

then furnish the negative test results to the United States Marshals Service upon the arrestee's arrival to

the Dirksen Courthouse.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a detainee who wishes to do so is entitled to consult with the

Federal Defender Program prior to administration of the test.

This order will remain in effect until further order of the Court.
