IOP20. Consents to Proceed Before a Magistrate Judge

- (a) Notice of Availability. Whenever a civil action is filed in this District, the clerk shall advisemust notify the person filing the complaintparties of the availability of a magistrate judge to exercise jurisdiction by informing the person that the magistrate judge consent form may be obtained on the Court's website. The plaintiff's counsel is responsible for advising the defendant or defendants of the availability of a magistrate judge to exercise jurisdiction. See LR 73.1(b).
- **(b)** Notice to Newly Joined Party Added After Consent Occurs. Whenever a party is added to a case the district judge or magistrate judge to whom the case is assigned will directafter the case has been transferred to a magistrate judge on consent, the clerk towill inform the additional party of the availability of a magistrate judge to exercise jurisdiction. If the additional party does not consent to proceed before a magistrate judge within 30 days of appearance, the magistrate judge will transfer the case to the calendar of the district judge to whom the case was previously assigned. See LR 73.1(f).
- (c) Joint Statements of Consent. Parties shall consent to proceed before a magistrate judge by filing a joint statement of consent. The joint statement shall be a form approved by the Executive Committee. Unless the form is completed in open court before the district or magistrate judge, the form shall be filed electronically. The joint statement shall be filed only after all parties have signed it. See LR 73.1(c).
