REAPPOINTMENT OF AN INCUMBENT MAGISTRATE JUDGE

The current term of office of United States Magistrate Judge Morton Denlow will expire on February 29, 2012.

Magistrate Judge Denlow is a full-time United States magistrate judge in the Eastern Division of the Northern District of Illinois, with a regular place of office at Chicago, Illinois. As such, his responsibilities include the conduct of preliminary proceedings in federal criminal cases, the trial and disposition of federal misdemeanor cases upon consent of the litigants, the conduct of various pretrial matters and evidentiary proceedings on reference from a district judge of the court, and the trial and disposition of federal civil cases upon consent of the litigants.

A further description of the position is contained in the Federal Magistrate Judges Act, Title 28 U.S.C. § §631-636, and in the Local Rules for the Northern District of Illinois.

In deciding to consider the reappointment of Magistrate Judge Denlow to a new eightyear term, the Court is required to establish a panel of citizens to consider the reappointments. In order to assist the panel, the Court requests comments from members of the bar and public regarding this reappointment.
