Dear potential juror:

You have been summoned as a potential juror in the case of *Antrim Pharmaceuticals LLC. vs. Bio-Pharm, Inc.* I will refer to the plaintiff as "Antrim" and to the defendant as "Bio-Pharm."

Antrim contends that it made an agreement with Bio-Pharm to manufacture a pharmaceutical product, in exchange for reimbursement of Bio-Pharm's expenses and a percentage of the profits from commercial sale of the product. Antrim contends that Bio-Pharm breached the agreement by refusing to ship the product after it had been approved for sale and by demanding an ownership interest in the product. Antrim contends that as a result, it was unable to bring the product to market and suffered monetary losses. Bio-Pharm denies Antrim's contentions.

Bio-Pharm contends that no final agreement was ever reached and that Antrim did not suffer monetary losses due to Bio-Pharm's actions. Bio-Pharm also contends that Antrim promised to give it a percentage of ownership of the product and that Bio-Pharm suffered damages when Antrim did not follow through on this promise. Antrim denies that it made any such promise.

To streamline the process of jury selection, I have prepared the attached questionnaire. Please take a few moments to complete it. Although I have not given you a great deal of space for your answers, please do your best to write legibly, so that I and the lawyers in the case can read your answers. Because your answers may assist me and the lawyers in the process of jury selection, it is very important for you to be truthful and accurate in answering the questions.
