## Topics Include

**Housing**: The nation's first major public housing desegregation lawsuit, *Gautreaux et al. v. Chicago Housing Authority* and its companion suit, dramatically impacted public housing in Chicago as well as public housing law and policy nationwide.

**Voting Rights**: Cases like *King v. St. Bd. Of Elections*, and *Barnett v. City of Chi.*, addressed redistricting plans and dilution of the vote.

**Employment**: The *Shakman* decrees barred the practice of political patronage in government employment.

**Sex Equality**: Class actions like *EEOC v*. *Dial* and *EEOC v*. AT&T helped to shape the workplace for women by addressing systemic discrimination claims.
