Dear potential juror:

You have been summoned as a potential juror in the case of *United States v. Ray Longstreet and Kenneth Wallace*. Mr. Longstreet and Mr. Wallace are charged with criminal offenses. Specifically, they are charged with conspiracy to distribute, and to possess with the intent to distribute, various types of narcotics, including powder cocaine, "crack" cocaine, heroin, and marijuana, as well as other related criminal charges. Mr. Longstreet is also charged with the offense of unlawful possession of a firearm.

Mr. Longstreet and Mr. Wallace deny that they are guilty of the charges. Both Mr. Longstreet and Mr. Wallace are presumed to be innocent, and before they can be convicted, the government must prove their guilt beyond a reasonable doubt.

In order to streamline the process of jury selection, the Court has prepared the attached questionnaire. Please take a few moments to complete it. Although I have not given you a great deal of space for your answers, please do your best to write legibly so that I and the lawyers in the case can read your answers. Because your answers may assist me and the lawyers in the process of jury selection, it is very important that you be truthful and accurate in answering the questions. When you come to the courtroom, we may ask you some additional questions.

At the conclusion of the jury selection process, all of the questionnaires will be returned to the Court, and they will not be made part of the public record in the case.
