Dear potential juror:

You have been summoned as a potential juror in the case of United States v. Syed Ather. Dr. Ather is a medical doctor. He is charged with health care fraud, specifically, participating in a scheme to defraud Medicare to obtain unlawful payments.

The charges are only accusations. Dr. Ather has pleaded not guilty to the charges and contends that he acted in good faith. He is presumed to be innocent of the charges. Before a person who is charged with a crime can be convicted, the government must prove his guilt beyond a reasonable doubt.

In order to streamline the process of jury selection, the Court has prepared the attached questionnaire. Please take a few moments to complete it. Although I have not given you a great deal of space for your answers, please do your best to write legibly so that I and the lawyers in the case can read your answers. Because your answers may assist me and the lawyers in the process of jury selection, it is very important that you be truthful and accurate in answering the questions. When you come to the courtroom, we may ask you some additional questions.

At the conclusion of the jury selection process, all of the questionnaires will be returned to the Court, and they will not be made part of the public record in the case.
