Mr. Zamora claims that they failed to knock and announce their presence before entering the residence and then acted unreasonably in conducting the search, by destroying certain personal property and using excessive force against him. He also claims the Officers failed to intervene to stop this. The City and the Officers deny these allegations.

Although you will not have a great deal of space for your answers, try to write legibly so that we can read your answers.
